ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

Advance Factory New Ross

In 2023, WCC advertised for expressions of interest to develop an advance factory on council owned lands in New Ross. A preferred investor who is willing to explore a partnership with WCC and has the capacity to deliver this project has now been identified. It is expected that Heads of Agreement will be signed in Q4 2024 if the project feasibility provides a favourable outcome.

Georgia Southern University

The joint efforts of Georgia Southern University and WCC in the delivery of GSU's International Learning Campus in Wexford and the provision of student accommodation in the old Adoration Convent were the focus of a recent Nationwide programme on RTE. Dermot's Taste of Ireland

A new 5 part television series featuring Wexford Ambassador, Dermot O Leary aired on ITV in September and will also be available on the streaming service ITVX.

The first episode of 'Dermot's Taste of Ireland' featured County Wexford and provided a significant showcase for all the county has to offer.

There was significant promotion of the show across the UK with Dermot interviewed on Good Morning Britain and coverage also featuring in a range of UK titles including the Travel Trade Gazette and Country & Townhouse. The series is supported by Tourism Ireland and is expected to be seen by millions of people across Britain.



In the Wexford episode, viewers saw Dermot, pick Wexford strawberries at Danescastle Fruit Farm, cook in Mary Barry's, visit Curracloe Beach, make butter at Saltrock Dairy and practice hurling at Chadwicks Wexford Park with his Dad Sean and some of the Wexford hurling team.

Get Exporting Programme

Strengthening the Irish-owned exporting sector is one of the documented priorities of the White Paper on Enterprise, the LEO policy paper has specified a national target of 360 plus first-time exporting companies each year by 2030. At LEO national level, a dedicated central team for new exporters has been established, in conjunction with Enterprise Ireland, to assist companies that have not yet ventured into exporting, providing support to enhance their market entry capabilities. Following a shortlisting process, seven LEO Wexford companies have been selected to participate on the inaugural "Get Exporting" Programme which is due to commence on 28th October 2024. Participation in the Programme will assist businesses to formulate an actionable Export Plan, get early in-market exposure to buyers, channels and distributors in addition to a tailored ed support package from research and prospection through to support with negotiations and deal closure.

Supporting Businesses to Go Digital

The recently published Local Enterprise office policy statement sets out the implementation plan to foster digitalisation in enterprise as prioritised in the White Paper and sets out an objective of 90% digital intensity in small business by 2030.



On October 2nd, 52 Entrepreneurs from Wexford joined 170 contemporaries from Carlow, Kilkenny and Waterford at the Digital 25 South Event at The Foundry @ Google in Dublin. The initiative, organised by the Local Enterprise office, was designed to inspire businesses to embrace the power of technology and foster a proactive approach to redefining their operations in today's digital age. After a welcome address by Vanessa Hartley, Head of Google Ireland, attendees engaged in a series of training seminars and workshops that highlighted various digital and AI tools and strategies. These sessions aimed to help businesses enhance productivity, expand their reach, and ultimately strengthen their operations. Annette Rowsome, Senior Enterprise Development Officer at LEO Wexford, discussed the digital supports available to SMEs, including free digital consultancy through the Digital for Business initiative. She also highlighted the Grow Digital voucher, which provides financial assistance of up to €5,000, covering 50% of eligible costs to help businesses implement digitalisation projects. Darragh O'Ciarba from Wexford based Business Groopeze participated in a panel discussion led by Cera Ward, Managing Director, Large Customer Sales, Google.







Forward Planning

The National Planning Framework

The Forward Planning Section, in consultation with other sections of the Council, prepared a detailed submission to ensure that County Wexford receives tailored support and targeted investment for the duration of the revised Framework. They key themes of the submission were.

- The requirement for alignment of the NPF and investment proposals in the National Development Plan
- Support for the Eastern Economic Corridor from Belfast to Rosslare Europort
- The need for policies that will ensure balanced regional development and parity and a shift from development centred on the Dublin and the mid-eastern region
- The requirement for policies to address the issues being experienced in the south-east region (which are acknowledged in the NPF)
- Support for critical key enablers for County Wexford and the south-east including the Wexford Campus of S.E.T.U., Tier 1 status for Rosslare Europort and the Oilgate-Rosslare N11-N25 upgrade
- Support for a southern axis to connect the Eastern Economic Corridor to the Atlantic Economic Corridor to enhance intra-regional connectivity in the Southern Region
- The requirement to recognise housing viability challenges, especially the challenges associated with apartment and brownfield development and the need for policy and financial supports and appropriate flexibility in zoning provisions
- Recognition of the Marine potential of County Wexford, in particular the potential for development linked with offshore renewable energy, associated development at Rosslare Europort and Kilmore Quay and the potential for synergies with S.E.T.U., Tradebridge, Georgia Southern University and the recently established Southeast Offshore Wind Partnership.

Wexford Town Local Area Plan

Work on the Wexford Town Local Area Plan is advancing. The LAP team are progressing strategy development and completing site work that will inform the overall spatial planning framework for the plan area.

The Urban Design Strategy consultants, Loci, continue to progress their work on the Ballynagee Master Plan and will present their progress to the Members of the Borough District at their October meeting. Work has commenced on the Town Centre Regeneration Strategy which will form part of the plan and a productive first meeting of the Town Team has taken place.

Wexford County Development Plan 2022-2028

A monitoring system has been established in accordance with the requirements of the Planning Act 2000 (as amended) and the Development Plan Guidelines for Planning Authorities. There are two strategic monitoring elements to this system:

- 1. Core Strategy Monitoring to be reported on annually, and
- 2. Plan Objectives Monitoring (including Strategic Environmental Assessment monitoring) to be reported on by the Chief Executive every two years.

The Forward Planning Section are currently preparing the Core Strategy Report for the second year of the Plan (i.e. 1st July 2023 to 30th June 2024). The report will provide details on house completions and planning permissions granted for dwellings and commercial units.

Work is ongoing on the Chief Executive's Report on the achievement of the objectives of the Plan. The Plan contains over 1,200 objectives covering the Council's key programmes, activities and projects, and monitoring ensures that these objectives are being met as set out. It is apparent that significant progress has been made by the Elected Members and the various sections of the Council in progressing the objectives of the Plan.

It is anticipated that both reports will be submitted to the Members in Q4 2024.



Access Items

The Access Office attended the launch of **VOICE** in the Riverside Park Hotel on September 18th. VOICE is a project undertaken by Independent Living Movement Ireland (ILMI) and is the first Disability Persons Organisation (DPO) established in Co. Wexford. DPO's are an important step in promoting and protecting the rights of people with disabilities.

We hosted a stand at the recent **Age Friendly Expo** in St Joseph's Community Centre on September 19th. It was a great opportunity to meet members of the public in Wexford and hear about the challenges with access they face.

Make Way Day 2024. Members of the Access team were in Gorey to mark the event with a walkability audit of the main streets, led by An Cathaoirleach Pip Breen. They were joined by a number of local organisations who work with people with disabilities. The event highlighted the everyday obstacles that make it harder for people to use our public footpaths.



REGENERATION UNIT

Town Centre First

We have Town Centre First Teams active in seven towns in County Wexford with each town at different stages of the journey.

Measure 1 - Taghmon, Bunclody and Castlebridge were successful in receiving €10,000 per town and teams have been established.

The teams have already met twice and are working with the Regen Unit and Dr Yvonne Byrne in creating a Health check with the remaining funding to be used for capacity building.

Measure 2 - Courtown/Riverchapel was successful in its application for €30,000. Wexford County Council is adding an additional €30,000 and the process has formally commenced with the appointment of LOCI consultants to assist in the delivery of this Plan.

Measure 3 - Feachtas Ealaian - T/A St Michaels Theatre & Kilmore Scope were successful Project Developments which received €49,500 each. Work has already commenced with these groups to develop these projects.

Enniscorthy and New Ross are already established and work will continue to promote Town Centre First values and principles with all teams

MAJOR NATIONAL ROADS PROJECTS

N11/N25 Oilgate to Rosslare Harbour

The Project is in Phase 3 – Design and Environmental Evaluation. Real Estate Consultancy Service tenders are under assessment. The design of the Project is progressing, including additional tasks in relation to the Service Area requirements and Active Travel provisions.

Traffic Model is being updated with revised 2024 traffic surveys. Consultation with larnrod Éireann about the railway protection structure at River Slaney Bridge crossing has commenced. Preparation of Environmental, Planning, Design and other reports are ongoing.

Project Team is preparing progress report to be submitted in next month to the European Climate, Infrastructure and Environment Executive Agency (CINEA).

N25 Rosslare Europort Access Road

The Project is in Phase 5 – Enabling and Procurement. Coordination with OPW/Irish Rail in relation to the OPW/Irish Rail temporary works and N25 Rosslare Europort Access Road is ongoing.

Technical Advisors are progressing through the Phase 5 (Enablement & Procurement) deliverables. Archaeological Services (Stage 1-4) tender documents are completed and publication of the Tender is expected next month.

Irish Rail Technical Approvals Process is ongoing for the proposed Railway overbridge on the scheme.



NATIONAL ROAD PAVEMENT SCHEMES

Safety Schemes

N25 Tagoat - Feasibility and Options Report has approved by TII. Tenders have been invited from consultants for the design phase.

2024 Pavement Schemes

<u>HD28 N25 Blackhorse to Ballykelly Pavement Scheme</u> – (Estimated Total Scheme Cost is €1,000,000). This scheme commenced on the 30th. September and will be completed by the 18th. October.

<u>VRS (Vehicle Restraint System – Safety Barrier) Maintenance</u>

This contract commenced in 2023. Barrier survey works are continuing. However routine barrier repairs have been suspended for the remainder of the year due to TII funding constraints in the current year.

Community Involvement Schemes

A grant of €502,650 was received to complete 8 road sections this year. Six of the eight are complete with the remaining roads awaiting contractors.

<u>Severe Weather - Flood Damaged Bridges</u>

Temporary Bailey Bridges are in place at Chapel and Cullenstown Little in the New Ross District. The contractor is appointed and scheduled to commence in October.

Specific Improvement Grants

A grant of €1,005,000 was received for the Owenduff river embankment stabilisation (R733 Wellingtonbridge) and to complete payments for the works on the Deeps Bridge. Works to commence in October.

Grange Beach Works coastal protection works have commenced under the supervision and assistance of the Environment Section.

Local Improvement Schemes

The programme included 17 lanes with 10 complete and remaining awaiting preparatory works for contractors or direct labour.

Newtown Road - Phase 1

Final account negotiations currently underway with RPS PRE..

Newtown Road Phases Two and Three (Part of the Pathfinder Project)

Phases Two and Three of the Newtown Road cycle scheme design will involve the continuation of the footpath upgrades from Applegreen to Bayview Drive at Wygram. Tender documents are being finalised for advertisement in Q4 2024.

Beechlawn/Clonard Cycle Scheme (Part of the Pathfinder Project)

Consultation with local landowners is continuing, including HSE and adjoining homeowners.

Part 8 documents are being prepared by the technical services consultants.

Proposals to extend this scheme to include works at Kennedy Park School will be in the scope of works for the Part 8 consultation process.

Roxborough Cycle Scheme (Part of the Pathfinder Project)

This Pathfinder Scheme is at the final stages of Phase 3 design and will proceed to the Part 8 process in Q4 2024.

Safe Routes to School Launches

Ramsgrange Community School will be proceeding to construction in October. The AT team is currently developing the preliminary design for Gorey Central School and will follow a Section 38 consultation process.

Crossabeg NS preliminary design has commenced which includes footpath buildout, bollards and lining to front of school to improve pedestrian/vehicular separation.

Wexford Town Area Based Transport Assessment (ABTA)

Options Development Report has been completed by the consultant and reviewed internally by WCC and the NTA, who are project sponsors, letting the project progress to Part 2b. The plan is 50% complete giving a final draft date of Q1 2025.

Enniscorthy Town Area Based Transport Assessment (ABTA)

Baseline report (Part 1 of 6) has been completed and currently is under review by WCC and the NTA.

Old Dublin Road, Enniscorthy

A topographical survey is complete, and this will inform the preliminary design and options for an active travel scheme.

Gorey to Courtown Footpath

Footpath construction with associated civil works are progressing with 40% of the project complete.

SPEED LIMIT REVIEW

Implementation of the new 60km/h Default Speed Limits

The implementation of the new 60km/h default speed limits on all L-class (county) roads in the county will be effective from a date (to be advised by the Department of Transport) in November 2024.

The current speed limits of 100km/h on all N-class (national primary and secondary) roads, 80km/h on R-class (regional) roads and 50 or 60 km/h on urban roads will remain in place.

The installation of new poles and signs is underway in the necessary locations in preparation. The default speed limit sign will be used extensively.

PUBLIC LIGHTING

LED Upgrade (National Roads)

The LED lantern replacement on Scurlocksbush, Templescoby and Milehouse roundabouts will be completed by the end of October.

LED Upgrade (Non-National Roads)

Plans are in place to have public lighting fully upgraded to LED by the end of 2025.

Public Lighting Development Fund

Projects currently out for pricing in Kilmuckridge, Castlebridge and Ballindaggin.

Smaller infill projects are also taking place in each District.

CAPITAL PROJECTS

PROJECTS AT PLANNING STAGES

Enniscorthy Town Centre & Tourism Project:

The Part 8 process for the Market Square project was concluded on 9th September 2024, with the Council approving the scheme with amendments to address matters raised during the public consultation process.

Preliminary design work on the Enniscorthy Castle Quarter project is ongoing and it is intended make a Part 8 submission for this in Q1 2025. A presentation will be made at the November EMD meeting.

Forth Mountain Activity Park - Phase 2 - Activity Centre Building

The activity centre building is currently on hold. It is planned to re tender out the boathouse and associated works before the end of 2024.

John Street Grainstore, New Ross

An application for Category 1 funding, under the RRDF, was submitted on 8th February, which was unsuccessful. A further development consent application will be made to An Bord Pleanála in the coming months for the public realm area to the rear of the property.

WEXFORDIA - updates

- Hook Lighthouse
- The Tender assessment for the associated architectural and related design services is complete and appointment is imminent.
- New Ross Tourism Project
- Both teams are working towards the completion of a familiarisation and preliminary design plan in advance of an application for Part VIII development consent in Q2 2025.

Esmonde Street, Gorey

The project is currently progressing through detailed design, with a tender competition for a works contractor to be published to etenders in November 2024.

Courtown Coastal Protection & Beach Nourishment Scheme

It is planned to submit an application to An Bord Pleanála for development consent in 2025, subject to advance approval of a Marine Area Consent by the Marine Area Regulatory Authority.


Enniscorthy Sports Hub

Ferndale Gymnasium and MUGAs, Wexford:

Construction commenced onsite on 30th September 2024.





Curracloe Water Sports Activity Facility

The main works contract has been awarded to Kilcaven Construction with construction commencing on site in early October 2024.

Adoration Convent Wexford

It is intended to tender out these works out in October 2024, with works planned to commence in Q1 2025.

St Waleran's Link Road

As no tenders were returned, options for the expedient appointment of consultants are currently being advanced. We hope to make appointment in the coming weeks.

Enniscorthy Technology Park Phase 2

Tenders have been received for design consultants to design, procure and supervise construction of the Phase 2 road and associated services at Enniscorthy Technology Park. Appointment is anticipated before end of 2024.

Enniscorthy Technology Park – IDA Advance Factory Building

We are currently out to tender for an architect-led design team to prepare a planning application for a proposed advance factory building in Enniscorthy Technology Park.

PROJECTS UNDER CONSTRUCTION

South East Greenway

Work on Phase 2, a 5.5 km section from Ferrybank to Curraghmore is due for completion in December 2024. Some further works will be required prior to opening this stretch of greenway in Q1 2025.

Trinity Wharf

Procurement of site investigation works is ongoing with SI works expected to commence in Q4 2024, after which Irish Rail will build a level crossing for site access ahead of the main construction contracts.

Mechanics Institute, Wexford

We are now commencing to scope up the required works to prepare the building for community use. It is planned to have the building ready for occupancy by Q4 2025.

CAPITAL PROJECTS cont'd

Murphy Floods Redevelopment

Works will be complete on site by mid—October. We are currently developing plans for an interim car park an public realm, to be complete before end of 2024.

FLOOD DEFENCE SCHEMES

Enniscorthy Flood Relief Scheme - Phase 1 - New River Slaney Bridge Project

The planning application is to be submitted in Q4 2025.

Wexford Town and Environs Flood Relief Scheme

The LIDAR survey along Wexford Quay has not been carried out due to weather conditions at the appropriate tide levels. The contractor who was originally appointed to undertake the survey has agreed to remove themselves from the contract and a new contractor has been appointed. The survey is programmed to be carried out by the end of October. This inability to fly has caused a delay event in the programme as the critical path item coastal modelling cannot be completed without this survey

Surveys are being carried out on the river channels including:

- CCTV of culverts
- Structural surveys of the culverts, bridges and retaining walls

Contractors have been appointed to continue the monitoring of wintering birds in the study area.



HOUSING

Housing Strategy & Services

Under the Housing for All Programme 2022 to 2026, Wexford County Council must deliver a minimum of 1,159 new housing units within the programme timeframe. The status of overall programme delivery is contained in the diagram below.

It is the Councils intention to continue to deliver new housing, above the target provided under the programme, where demand exists and Department funding is available.

Turnkey Delivery

The Housing Section periodically seek Expressions of Interest for the provision of social housing units via Turnkey Acquisition. **The next Expression of Interest will open on 9th October 2024.** All calls are seeking targeted delivery of smaller unit types (1 & 2 beds) in areas of need identified in the Housing Delivery Action Plan (HDAP). In addition, the process also seeks proposals for purchase of land in areas of need. All proposals received by Wexford County Council under the turnkey process are assessed by an Internal Assessment Committee.

Ferndale Street Soccer Programme

A Street Soccer Programme commenced on the newly installed astro pitches at Ferndale in September. This partnership programme between SCHP, Wexford FC and FDYS has proven hugely successful with local children and teenagers. Wexford FC's Football and Social Responsibility Officer Mark Ross and his coaching team have become familiar faces to many of the kids who now frequent the Ferndale astro pitches. Local councillors recently paid a visit to Ferndale along with Mayor George Lawlor, Ann Marie Laffan from Sláintecare Healthy Communities and Debbie Roche of FDYS to distribute footballs, t-shirts, drinks and snacks to the participants. Wexford Community Gardaí are regular visitors, with this project helping to build relationships between local young people and the Gardaí.



Southand Retrofitting Pilot Project

Amanda Stewart, CEO of High-Performance Building Alliance (HPBA) represented HPBA and Wexford County Council at the UN in Geneva on 16th September and shared information on the Southend Retrofitting project during her presentation. This project, funded and facilitated by SHCP enabled householders in the Maudlintown area of Wexford Town with the support of Southend FRC and Wexford Town Sustainable Energy Communities to access 100% funded SEAI grants to retrofit their homes. Almost 100 householders have availed of this service to date with works already underway in many homes. SETU are undertaking research on the impacts on the health and wellbeing of the homeowners following retrofitting.

Enniscorthy Inter Agency Team meeting - met in September and the meeting had updates from the members and working groups and a presentation from Dr. Dean Phelan, CONUNDRUM project.

Gimont Tea on the Green - Gimont Ave and Cluain Dara in Enniscorthy

The event was a result of collaboration between the recently formed Gimont Residents Association, Enniscorthy East Community Development, Wexford County Council's Sláintecare Healthy Communities Programme and Fire Services, Creative Places Enniscorthy, County Wexford PPN, Wexford Local Development, Enniscorthy Tidy Towns, An Garda Síochána, Enniscorthy Community Alliance, FDYS, HSE and many more artists. Many of the residents came out and took part in activities, met the agencies and built relationships.

Funding for the newsletter comes from Wexford County Council and the Sláintecare Healthy Communities Programme.





ASI Dementia Awareness Training

SHCP arranged Dementia Awareness training for colleagues in Sports Active Wexford, Age Friendly and Healthy Wexford. The training, delivered by the Alzheimer's Society of Ireland (ASI) will be adapted for sports clubs, tutors and others involved in sport to give them the skills and knowledge to assist people living with dementia. Funding for this training was given by Healthy Wexford.

AGE FRIENDLY WEXFORD

Little Kneaders Make Your Own Therapy Dough - Bunclody Library

During the Therapy Dough Workshop, each participant made two therapy dough's using 100% natural hand blended oils from Cork designed to awaken the mind and provide moments of calm. Therapy dough is proven to improve muscle memory in the hands, strengthen the muscles in the fingers and hand, reduce anxiety and reduce heart rates by refocusing the mind to the hands. Breath-work and direction of daily rituals to provide mindful moments was incorporated into the workshop.

Age Well Expo

Age Friendly Wexford, Wexford PPN and Age Friendly Healthy Home Wexford held an Age Well expocentred around services, supports and activities available to older people in St Joseph's Community Centre Wexford Town. This free event, showcased the services, supports and activities available to older people to lead fulfilling, healthy and active lives. On the day there was over 30 exhibition stands. There were stands on a range of services provided by Wexford County Council. Information was provided on how to reduce energy costs, housing grants, community engagement initiatives, recreational activities tailored for older adults and much more.



Informative talks on topics ranged from Fraud Safety, Crime Prevention, Fire Safety, Healthy Homes and Keeping your Brain Active were also delivered on the day. The feedback from the day was very positive.

Tirlan Farmlife Store Achieving Age Friendly Business Status:

On 26th September, Tirlan Farmlife hosted the relaunch of their store in Inch as they had achieved Age Friendly Business Recognition. There were several changes initiated to the store to achieve this namely, making the ramp at the entrance to the shop less steep following feedback from Wheelchair users, making the aisle wider, having chairs for people to sit on and reading glasses available along with appointing an Age Friendly Champion. Tirlan are working to achieve achieve Age Friendly Business status for other Wexford stores.

On 4th September, World Sexual Health Day, we highlighted the importance of sexual health as an important part of our overall health and wellbeing, sharing details of our Period Dignity leaflets, highlighting FREE Period Product locations across Co. Wexford, for those that need them.

The 'Let's Talk About Suicide' Online Resource and available webinars were promoted, as was an upcoming safeTALK suicide alertness training course – an event that will now take place on 26th November at Wexford County Council.

The Country Connects Captures initiative aimed to bring a creative aspect to the Country Connects monthly social walks and was supported by Creative Ireland Wexford.

Country Connects is a collaboration of Wexford Walking Trails, WCC, Wexford IFA & Healthy Wexford. Through social media Healthy Wexford continues to share relevant information. October key dates and activities are Positive Ageing Week, National Breastfeeding Week, Fire Safety Week and Mental Health Day/Month.

Supporting **Mental Health Month** a display of Mental Health & Wellbeing supports from a range of partners is on display in WCC. Staff and the public are encouraged to take the resources they need.

Climate Action

Climate Action Plan

Progress continued on the implementation of the actions in the Climate Action Plan with key staff updating on the progress across 240 Key Performance Indicators (KPIs). The new Energy Officer started in September.

The Climate Action Team continued to input to the review of policies and procedures to ensure Climate Proofing is considered and mainstreamed across all functions and Services.

- Climate Action will be a recurring topic at Executive team meetings
- A demonstration on how the Climate Action Plan was formulated was provided to the Corporate Plan Working Group
- Review of Events Management Guide to include Climate Proofing
- Proposals from the Climate Action team which will encourage a reduction in Fossil Fuel travelled in accordance with Action GL 5 of the Plan was sent to the GP for consideration and inclusion in the review of Travel Policy
- Additional element has been added to the Procurement Section of the Project Endorsement Proposal (PEP) to outline the Green Public Procurement (GPP) elements included in the project.

Training/Events

Events and training workshops are scheduled over the next 2 months. These include 4 workshops on Activating Decarbonisation Zones across the themes of Built Environment, Community Activation, Natural Environment and the Bioeconomy. The ESTG Annual Conference takes place on 15th October.

Sustainable Energy Communities

The Energy Master Plan (EMP) for Fethard-on-Sea Sustainable Energy Community (SEC) has been completed and will be launched in October.

Community Climate Action Programme

€669,000 has been allocated to 16 community groups across Co Wexford to deliver local climate action projects. All 16 groups have signed their contract offers and pre-commencement site inspections were carried out. Projects are now moving into the delivery phase with works commencing shortly.

Projects that include energy efficiency measures have had their baseline energy consumption assessed, with a view to applying for a once-off "energy credit" payment upon completion of their works. The South East Energy Agency are assisting in this process.

There are now 27 registered Dog Breeding Establishments with several applications on hand awaiting inspection.

XL Bully Regulation under SI 491/2024

New ownership rules have been introduced to protect public safety following several attacks by XL Bully type dogs.

From 1st October 2024, it is illegal to import, breed, rehome or resell an XL Bully dog and from 1st February 2025, it will be illegal to own an XL Bully unless you have a Certificate of Exemption or proof of application.

XL Bully owners have between October 1st 2024 and January 31st 2025 to apply for a Certificate of Exemption. An additional limited exception to this regulation is in place for animal charities and shelters who have XL Bullys in-situ on October 1st 2024. In order to apply for a lifetime certificate for an XL Bully, a completed application form, including supporting documentation must be submitted to the Environment & Climate Action section of Wexford County Council before January 31st 2025 (supporting documentation includes proof of owners identity and address; a copy of the dog licence; a cert of microchipping and confirmation of neutering).

Environment Education and Awareness:

Our aim is to promote awareness and active participation in a range of environmental initiatives.

Rubbish Film Festival: Expressions of interests were sought from all secondary schools for participation in the festival for 2024 /2025 academic year. The programme is being run with 7 schools.

Leave No Trace Workshops: 10 primary schools will be funded for the academic year 2024 /2025. 10 primary schools have been offered this free workshop.

Picker Pals Programme: 10 primary schools will be funded for the academic year 2024/2025.

Composting in Schools Programme: Expressions of interest were circulated to secondary schools who were not part of the programme last year. (9 schools participated and completed the programme in 2023/2024 academic year). 4 secondary schools will participate this year. The programme will offer schools the opportunity to explore and improve waste management in and will look at waste separation systems and explore ways to improve waste management via waste prevention, reduction, reuse recycling and composting. The school will receive 2 visits, will create an action plan and all teachers will be given training and given access to BaseCamp so that they can avail of the resources developed so far for the programme including booklets, guides, instructional fact sheets, videos as well as learning resources that teachers can bring into the classroom. In addition, schools receive a €300 voucher for bins, tools and supplies to help carry out their action plans.

Green Schools: Green schools teacher seminar took place on-line on October 1st. All themes of the green schools programme will be covered. Communication with renewal schools will commence in September.

Community Clean Ups: Registrations and support for community clean ups continue.

Keep Wexford Beautiful: Judging is now complete, and awards will be presented at the annual Environment Awards which will take place on Monday 11th November.

Trees for Wexford Campaign: The 'Trees for Wexford Scheme' opened for applications in September. Groups could apply for trees or native hedging saplings. The scheme was open to voluntary groups.

Circular Living Month: Circular Living Month takes place in October and a number of events are planned. A Halloween children's costume swap event in partnership with Sustainable Enniscorthy will take place on Monday 14th October. A talk and demonstration entitled 'A Cleaner Greener House & Garden will take place on Thursday 24th October in Wexford, Enniscorthy and Gorey.

ARCHIVES

Collections management - September

There were 36 research remote enquiries & 7 researcher visits. Research topics included family history through the estate rentals for William Orme Foster's Camolin estate (1894); through the burial registers for Crosstown cemetery (1940-2000); research on references to TD Sinnott's retirement in 1953 and on the Lorna Rosbottom genealogical archive.

Acquisition

A historic collection belonging to the New Ross Workingmen's Club in Mary Street was deposited in the Archive. Included in the collection is a photo of the founding members of the club (Slater, 1899), minute books (the earliest dating from 1906), the original rent agreement on the Mary Street premises (16 Dec 1902) and a banner for the club. The club, which was founded in 1899 in the Tholsel, New Ross celebrates its 125th anniversary this year. A formal handover of the collection to the Archive will take place in the Tholsel in late October.

Outreach

Public access to the large photographic collection from amateur photographer, Gustavus Handcock from Colebrook House, Wellingtonbridge was progressed during September with an introductory page to the collection and three images uploaded to the Archive's website. The full collection of just over 200 digitised photographs will be uploaded to the site by early October. Covering the period 1885-1905, the photos captured family life, farming practices, the seasonal cycle of rural life, social events and historic monuments across the landscape of south-west County Wexford. The digital catalogue was researched and curated by Monica Wallace (with assistance from Creative Ireland).

ARTS

Westgate Artists' Studios Open Call

Westgate Heritage Centre and the adjacent prefab are now under the remit of the Arts Office and have been converted into visual artists workspaces and music rehearsal spaces. These spaces will open October 2024, and their day to day running will be managed by Wexford Arts Centre. Following an open call in August, four visual artists were selected to lease studio spaces in the prefab, with occupancy starting October 1st, 2024. The music rehearsal space will take bookings from November 2024. The Heritage Centre space will be used for pop up exhibitions with Wex Arts Opera festival exhibition opening on Sat 12 October. The Arts Office will continue to work with Wex Walks and the Lions Club to facilitate the existing heritage tours by the public to Westgate. The Arts Office will also launch a new artists workspace scheme this autumn to support artists form all over County Wexford to access workspaces.





Culture Night Wexford took place in September and was the largest to date with 68 free events taking place countywide across the 5 municipal districts. Run by the Local Authority Arts Offices in partnership with the Arts Council and Municipal Districts, Culture Night highlights the quality and diversity of Ireland's arts and cultural offering, while also introducing audiences to new arts venues and emerging creative talent- all for free. There were 27 events in Wexford town, 10 in Enniscorthy, 19 in Gorey-Kilmuckridge, 10 in New Ross. Rosslare hosted their very first event Filling the Well at Rosslare Strand National School. A major light projection celebrating Arts and Culture with live spoken word and music took place outside Wexford Arts centre for Culture night – funded through the Department's Culture Night late grant.

Community Dates for National Opera House Open Call

WCC in partnership with the National Opera House, is offering ten subsidised community dates in the Opera House for 2025 and 2026. The Arts office recently held an open call for expressions of interest. Final selection will be by lottery. All applications will be notified by Monday 14th October 2024.

Arts Ability Exhibition - County Hall August - Sept 2024

An exhibition of works by artists participating in Arts Ability, a partnership between WCC Arts office, the HSE and Wexford Mental Health Association ran in County Hall. The exhibition titled 'The Centre of Everything' celebrates the creative work of over 80 artists who participate in Arts Ability through visual art, creative writing and music/performance.

Arts Office Festivals Schemes September 2024

Write By the Sea Festival

Supported by the Arts Office Festival Fund, the festival took place in the village of Kilmore Quay with celebrated poet Patrick Cotter. Write by the Sea produces a literary programme that includes a mix of talks from renowned writers, readings, interviews and workshops.

New Ross Piano Festival

Supported by the Arts Office, this was the 18th festival at St Marys Church and featured some of the world's finest pianists such as Paul Lweis and Yukine Kuroki.

Supported by the Failte Ireland Festival fund through the Arts Office: The **30th Blackstairs Blues Festival** ran in various venues across Enniscorthy. It featured artists such as KJ McEvoy and Sean Taylor.

The **Kilanerin Food & Heritage Festival** took place Kilanerin Village and was headlined by celebrity chef Kevin Dundon. There were cookery demonstrations, talks, local heritage tours, demos and walks.









SCREEN WEXFORD

Shadowing Fund and Finishing Fund Open Call

Two new funds were launched in September to help emerging film makers in Wexford.

The Shadowing Fund: supports emerging filmmakers based in the County to gain experience in the film industry by shadowing on a film set in areas of Director, Producer, DOP, Art Dept, Gaffer, Editor, Scriptwriter, Script Editor. The Fund helps support their travel and accommodation costs.

Finishing Fund Supports an already-filmed short drama, documentary, or animation film in post-production costs. The award of up to €500 will be provided to emerging filmmakers based in the Wexford region. There will be 4 Finishing Funds per annum.

Crew Morning was held at The Hatch Lab in Gorey. The networking event was open to anyone interested in and/or currently working in video, gaming, social media, film and TV or any screen-related industries. This included writers, directors, producers, creators and crew from all departments. It was an opportunity for local filmmakers and talent in the Southeast to meet and network while hearing from Screen Wexford on upcoming training, opportunities, and initiatives.

CPE, in partnership with Orchard Recording Studios, announced a call out for participants for a series of free collaborative recording sessions in November. This is open to musicians of all levels and music backgrounds.

Growing My Art Practice – A Practical and Meaningful Guide Event

Emer Ferran, a project manager with VAI (Visual Arts Ireland) for local artists will talk about professional practice and arts and the growth of creative enterprises. It will take place on the 16th of October at Green Tech HQ Enniscorthy.

County Wexford Youth Theatre (CWYT), supported by WCC Arts Office, held an open day in their studios to recruit new members and give students a sense of what they have been doing and their future plans. CWYT currently engages with 50 students between the ages of 12–19 over 2 evenings per week on an annual basis. For Culture Night 10 young people staged a short play 'Seven Jewish Children' in the Wexford Arts Centre.

Youth Theatre provides access to young people interested in acting, writing, sound, lighting, directing, and creating new work on stage and on film. Most of CWYT's stage and film work has been devised by the group, based on issues and stories that they have created and that mean something to them.

CREATIVE IRELAND

Focus group for Irish Speaking Artists

Wexford's Creative and Cultural Strategy states that it will 'provide support for projects that promote the love and use of the Irish language in our community'. Groundwork with communities of Irish speakers is being developed. A bi-lingual session brought together 14 Irish speaking artists and creatives living and working in County Wexford. They explored opportunities to develop collaborative projects that promote creative ways for people to speak, think and feel in Irish.

Cill Dara le Gaeilge presented to the group on its efforts to develop the language in a county that, like Wexford, does not have a Gaelteacht area. Growing this network will support Creative Ireland Wexford's 2025 programme, when specific funding for Irish language projects will be made available.

Global Youth Quest

The programme is an adventure for teenage girls living in Direct Provision Centres. Over six sessions, the girls explored trails, woods, beaches and walkways of Wexford through hiking, navigation and artistic interventions. Each hike featured a chosen artist who encouraged the girls to connect further with their surroundings by introducing them to different nature-based creative activity.

The sessions developed a sense of ownership and belonging to County Wexford by creating emotional bonds to the landscape. Working as a team will help the girls overcome feelings of isolation and provide a much needed peer support network.

Shared Island - New Associations

This project investigates how creative communities in Wexford and Belfast can collaborate through innovative technologies to address climate action, sustainability and major health inequalities as outlined in our strategy and the UN Sustainable Development Goals. Building on the connection we established between The MAC, Belfast and Wexford Arts Centre during Cruinniú 2024, two additional collaborators have joined the cross-border partnership - Gorey School of Art and Ulster University (Faculty of Life and Health Sciences and the Belfast School of Art). A series of in-person and online meetings for this project kicked off on September 27th.

Spoken Word with Stephen James Smith – Wexford Town

Exploring the connection young people from Selskar College and Presentation School Wexford have with climate change, this spoken word project began in September. It offers an opportunity for pupils to express their thoughts and feelings and uncover their unique voices. Led by spoken word artist Stephen James Smith, the young people will examine Smith's work and write their own spoken words pieces which will be developed for a performance called My Wexford.

My Wexford will be performed at the Wexford Arts Centre on 15th November, and the creative journey will be documented and disseminated across social media platforms such as Tik Tok.


Country Connects


Since April 2024, the Country Connects Gets Creative project has developed creative thinking through photography for the Wexford Walking Trails group. Joined by a professional photographer while they walk, participants were encouraged to see the landscapes through an alternative lens, while being guided through techniques and processes for capturing nature photos on a camera phone. This placemaking project develops observational skills, and a deeper appreciation and understanding of the biodiversity that makes the walking trails in Wexford so special and unique. A selection of the photographs were curated for an exhibition which was held in Barntown.

Social Dancing Classes

Beginning on 30th September, a series of social dancing classes brought older people in our community together to improve wellbeing and social interaction through movement. Dances included the jive, the quickstep and waltzes in a friendly and welcoming environment. Organised by Age Friendly Wexford and supported by Creative Ireland these sessions are an important part of Creative Ireland Wexford's wellbeing programme. Through creative activity and creative thinking, they stimulate holistic health benefits for individuals and animate the many local community hall venues that may otherwise be empty.

Over the past several months, the Local Authority Integration Team (LAIT) has been actively engaged in various projects aimed at fostering community inclusion across Wexford. In addition to our ongoing work hosting clinics in accommodation centres throughout the county, we have partnered with multiple organisations on a range of initiatives.

Number of clinics

In September the team, held 15 on site clinics in accommodation centres throughout Co. Wexford.

Interagency Work

The team is continuing to work in partnership with the GAA & FAI, introducing children from the Direct Provision centres to sports.

Meetings of the Integration Forum

Meeting took place on the 30.10.24 where Rósaí Nic Chárthaigh, The LAIT Coordinator from Kerry Council presented on the migrant survey's they have undertaken in Kerry.

National changes

In recent months, there have been significant changes in the International Protection System for Ukrainians as Beneficiaries of Temporary Protection (BOTP). These changes have included system consolidations and adjustments to the payments received by those in protection. The transitions have understandably caused distress, and our team has been actively supporting individuals through this process.

Accommodation

The team continue to place displaced Ukrainian families who are Beneficiaries of Temporary Protection Orders (BOTP's) in properties across Wexford, in both rural and urban areas.

FINANCE

Budget 2025

Work has commenced on the preparation of Budget 2025. Circular Fin 09/2024 has been received confirming Wexford County Council's provisional LPT Allocation (pre LAF adjustment) for 2025 at €15,126,453. This is the same baseline allocation as 2024 and therefore provides no additional income in baseline funding to the Council.

Cash Flow/Overdraft

The Council continues to operate with an overdraft facility, Ministerial Sanction is in place for borrowing by way of overdraft in the amount of €20m for the period to the 31st December, 2024. The requirement for ongoing overdraft facilities into 2025 requires a formal application which is included in the October meeting to secure Council approval and Ministerial sanction for an extension of the facility into 2025.

Audit

- Audit of Accounts 2023 The Audit of Wexford County Council's 2023 Accounts is ongoing. Once complete, the Local Government Auditor will prepare the Statutory Audit Report to be submitted for consideration of the Council as soon as possible thereafter.
- Audit Committee Proposals for the filling of the 3 external committee members is included in the October Council meeting for Members approval. The proposed date for the inaugural meeting of the new Audit Committee is Friday 25th October. The Audit Committee will also meet with the Local Government Auditor before the end of the year to discuss the outcome of the 2023 Audit. Following this the Audit Committee will prepare their report for the Council on the Annual Accounts and Audit process.
